Candidate should ride in an enclosed area without leading line, demonstrating control while maintaining a safe basic balanced position at the walk and trot, and should begin to develop the canter and jumping position. No need to canter over fences.

RIDING ON THE FLAT

Mount and dismount independently
(using mounting block if necessary)
Shorten and lengthen reins at halt and walk.
